#### Star Knowledge

From the mid-1950s, people had higher wages and were given holiday days from work. The first package holidays were offered in 1950 and people started to go abroad to Spain, leading to a decline in UK seaside resorts.

#### Star Knowledge

The first recorded picture postcard dates to 1894. In 1900, the Box Brownie camera was invented, so people could take photos on holiday for cheap. By the mid-1970s, video recorded were more widely available so people could film their holidays.

#### Learning Objective

- I can identify souvenirs and explain their significance.

#### Star Knowledge

A souvenir is an object collected or purchased on holiday to remember the experience. Lots of souvenirs contain images of places, like fridge magnets, mugs or t-shirts, which can tell us about holidays from the past.

#### Star Knowledge

We are going to hear a story that was written by a child that is the same age as you. This story is about a holiday that his Grandma went on when she was younger. Even though some of the details might be untrue, we can still use this story as historical evidence because it comes from someone who experienced a holiday in the 1950s.

- I can explain why holiday experiences were different.
